

CAC-Enabling Firefox v.4

- 1) Download and install Firefox:
<http://www.firefox.com/>
- 2) Open Firefox and install the latest DoD Configuration Add-on for Firefox:
<http://forge.mil/Resources-Firefox.html>
- 3) Restart Firefox when prompted.
- 4) The DoD Configurator should prompt to setup your CAC reader. If this fails continue to the next slide.

*Prerequisites:

- a) Install the latest Java: <http://java.com>
- b) Get the DoD Certificates for Firefox by installing DoD's InstallRoot MSI here:

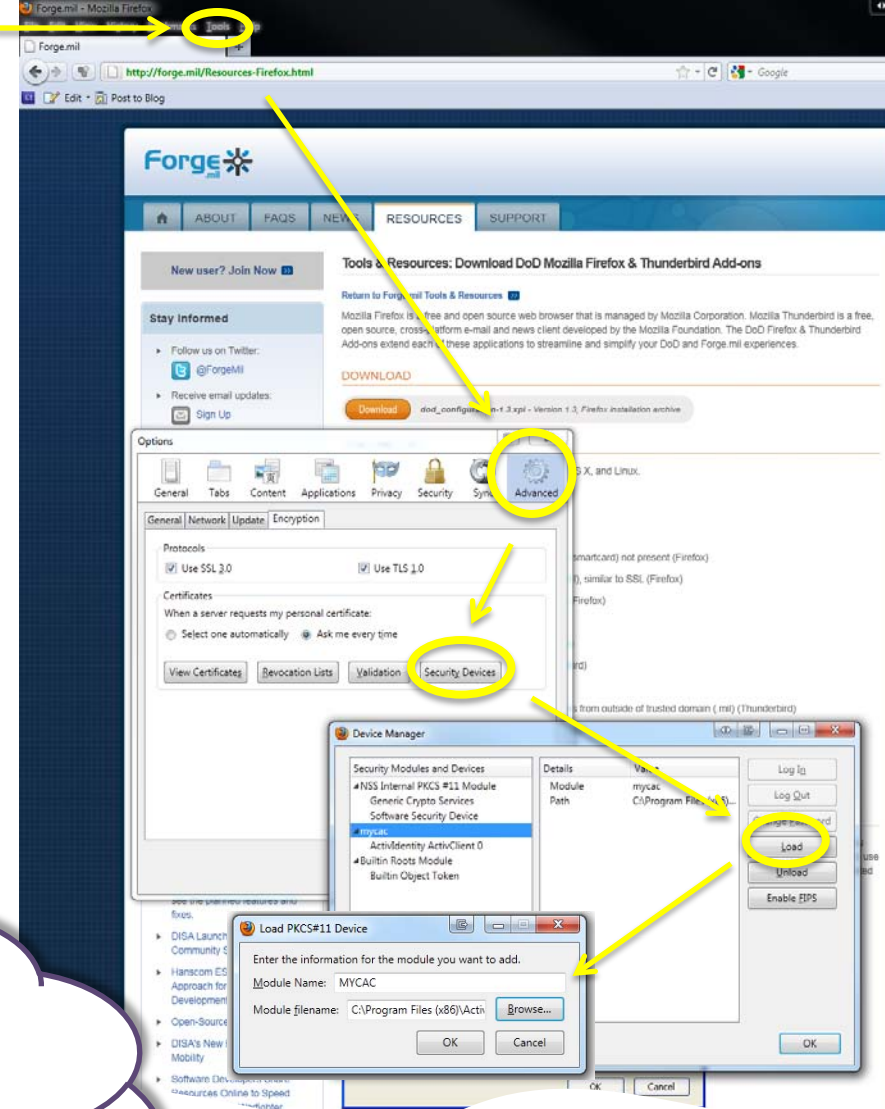

Here's how to manually add your CAC reader to Firefox:

- a) Open Firefox, go to Tools then Options.
- b) Select the Advance tab and click on Security Devices.
- c) The Device Manager window should appear, click on Load.
- i. Change the Module name to "MYCAC" or something else easy for you identify.
- ii. Click on Browse and navigate to:
 - o **32-Bit Windows:**
 - o C:\Program Files\ActivIdentity\ActivClient\acpkcs211.dll
 - o **64-Bit Windows:**
 - o C:\Program Files (x86)\ActivIdentity\ActivClient\acpkcs211.dll
- iii. Click OK and look for "MYCAC" in the Security Modules and Devices list, if it is there then you are good to go. Click OK on all windows and you should now be able to log into CAC enabled websites such as AKO/DKO.

Q: Do I have a 32 or 64-Bit copy of Windows?

A: Find an icon for "My Computer" on the desktop or under the Start Menu, right click and choose Properties. Look for the line titled "System type:" and it will say either 32-bit or 64-bit Operating System.
